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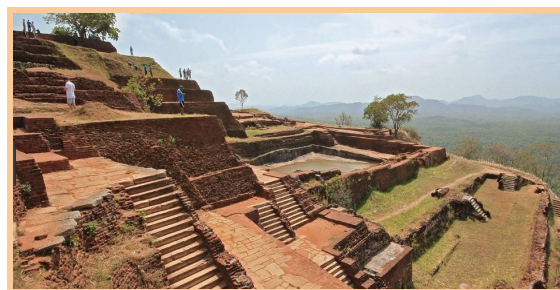
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6D5N HABARANA - KANDY - NUWARA ELIYA - BENTOTA - COLOMBO

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DAY 1 - AIR PORT - PINNAWALA - HABARANA

Arrive & thereafter you will be assisted to the Car park/ Coach park to begin your journey as per the booked itinerary. Proceed to Habarana and visit Pinnawala elephant orphanage on the way. **Pinnawala Elephant Orphanage** app. 55 miles from Colombo, off the Colombo - Kandy road is Pinnawala, where an orphanage was started in 1975 to house the abandoned and the wounded elephants. The number of elephants has increased to more than 65 now; including Baby Elephants brought from various parts, as well as some of the more than 25 babies born, as a result of the captive breeding programme. The best time to visit is the feeding time from 0930-1000 hrs and 1330-1400 hrs and the bathing time from 1000-1030 hrs and 1400-1430 hrs when all the elephants are taken to the river close by. Arrive in Dambulla and spend the rest of the day at leisure. Overnight stay at Habarana hotel.



DAY 2 - HABARANA - SIGIRIYA - DAMBULLA - KANDY - (B)

After breakfast at the hotel climb Sigiriya rock fortress. Afterwards proceed to Kandy via Dambulla cave temple. **Sigiriya** is home to the 5th Century "Fortress in the Sky" which is perhaps the most fantastic single wonder of the island. It is also known as Lion Rock because of the huge lion that used to stand at the entrance to the fortress. Within its triple-moated defence the huge rock rises almost to a sheer height of 500ft. On its summit are the foundations of what was once a great and sumptuous palace and gardens complete with swimming pool. On one of the stairways the only known ancient work of Sinhala secular painting survived in the form of Frescoes of life sized damsels in all the freshness and delicacy of their original colour. After breakfast at the hotel proceed to Kandy visiting Dambulla cave temple on the way. **Dambulla** is famous for the five cave Temples on a rock. The first 03 caves are better, older and larger than the other two. Some cave dates to 1st C.B.C. All the 5 cave walls and ceilings are covered with Buddhist murals and there are more than 130 Buddha statues, statues of Gods and Kings are also found here. Arrive in Kandy and enjoying the evening cultural dance performance. Overnight stay at a Kandy Hotel.

DAY 3 - KANDY - NUWARA ELIYA (B)

After breakfast at the hotel visits of tooth relic, a city tour of Kandy and visit Paradeniya botanical gardens. **Kandy** the hill capital venue of the annual Perahera. The last stronghold of the Sinhala Kings was finally ceded to the British in 1815. Kandy is an example of the Buddhism's influence in Sri Lanka today. Temple's shrines and monasteries keeping alive buddhist traditions are everywhere. **Temple of the Sacred Tooth Relic**, ever since 4th Century AD, when the Buddha's Tooth was brought to Sri Lanka hidden from sacrilegious hands in an Orissan princess' hair, the Relic has grown in repute and hiliness in Sri Lanka and throughout the Buddhist world. It is considered Sri Lanka's most prized possession. **Royal Botanical Gardens**, 147 acres in extent: Started in 1347 as a pleasure garden of the King's of Kandy. There are more than 5000 species of tree and plants. Some are endemic as well as flora from the tropical world. Spice garden and Orchid House are popular with Tourists. Afterwards proceed to Nuwara Eliya. Visit a tea factory plantation on the way. **Nuwara Eliya**, the 'Little England' of Sri Lanka is set against beautiful backdrops of Mountains, Valleys, Waterfalls and Tea Plantations. It is supposed to be one of the coldest places on the island, but is really just like England spring day although the temperature does drop at night. All around Nuwara Eliya you will see evidence of the British influence. Houses are like country cottages or Queen Ann style mansions. Spend the rest of the day at leisure. Overnight stay at a Nuwara Eliya hotel.

DAY 4 - NUWARA ELIYA - BENTOTA - (B)

After breakfast at the hotel proceed to Bentota. Arrive in Bentota and spend the day at leisure. Or visit turtle hatchery and enjoy a Mangrove boat ride in Madu River. **Turtle Hatchery**, the "Sea Turtle Farm & Hatchery" is a non - profitable organization which is maintained for the survival of Sea Turtles for the next generation. From the past, due to the cruel activities of humans, there is a danger that turtles are facing extinction. This rare varieties of Sea Turtle are destroyed by man day by day. It is the duty of each and every one to take action to save these turtles from extinction for the sake of our future generation. Regarding this we started to save Sea Turtles in 1986 and up to now we have succeeded to attain the goal gradually. **Mangrove Boat Ride in Madu River**. Madu river or Madu Ganga is one of the nature's fascinating creation off South West coast in Balapitiya. Madu Ganga is a lagoon with hundreds of islands providing an idyllic setting for a well spent holiday and loads of authentic traditional settings. It maybe one of the last remaining tracts of pristine mangrove forest in Sri Lanka. Overnight stay at Bentota hotel.

DAY 5 - BENTOTA- COLOMBO (B)

After breakfast at the hotel proceed to Colombo leisurely. Enjoy a city tour of Colombo. **Colombo**, a drive through the city taking you to the busy commercial areas as well as the tree-lined residential, Cinnamon Gardens. Visit Fort, the former British administrative centre and military garrison, Sea Street - the Goldsmith's quarters in the heart of Pettah, the Bazaar area, where is also a Hindu Temple with elaborate stone carvings, and the Dutch Church of Wolfendal dating back to 1749. Also visit the BMICH, see the replica of Avunka Buddha and Independence Square. Overnight stay at a Colombo hotel.

DAY 6 - COLOMBO - AIRPORT - (B)

After breakfast at the hotel proceed to airport for your scheduled flight with so much to remember and cherish one day! Have a safe flight!
